## Why

### **Community Objectives**

- To improve community health, employment and recreational KPI's
- To provide an all year round indoor facility for swimming servicing Devonport and surrounding districts
- Greatly expand Learn to Swim program
- Additional social & recreational opportunities for young people, elderly & those in need of aquatic therapies
- Swim training & competition
- Opportunities for aquatic club and meeting place for other sports clubs for fitness & rehabilitation
- Aquatic training & educational training programs lifesaving, first aid & water sports
- Opportunity for retail, fitness sport and recreational businesses to be co-located
- Job creation, construction, retail and sport and recreation
- Community engagement
- Health and well being (increased participation rates)





# Why

### Infrastructure Objectives

- 25 metre swimming pool
- infant water awareness /learn to swim & warm water exercise pool
- Space for spectator seating
- Foyer and reception
- Fitness gym
- Fitness program and multi-purpose room
- Café and seating for 30 patrons
- Change rooms, storage and first aid room







The following outcomes have been selected as the **Target Outcomes** for the Devonport Aquatic Centre:

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- **25 metre Indoor pool**: the construction of an indoor 25m pool will address the increasing demands of the community, in particular our aging population and learn to swim segments.
- **Child water awareness area**: the establishment of a water awareness area will complement the need for increased learn to swim facilities, in conjunction with providing enhanced facilities for families. The area will address indicators identifying Devonport's low ranking in the SEIFA (Socio economic Disadvantage) index, which along with median average earnings indicate the region is less wealthy and less able to cope with a reduction in economic activity.
- **Gymnasium**: the weight gymnasium will increase the bundle of benefits offered by the facility; provide additional revenue streams, and increase attendance numbers and participation rates.
- **Kiosk/café**: The kiosk/cafe will provide an alternate revenue stream, and supplement the gymnasium and retail offering.
- Warm water exercise pool: the warm water exercise pool will provide access to facilities targeted at our aging population. Currently greater than 30% of the Devonport population is aged 55+.




